From the Table 1 and Figure 1: it is observed that Mineral fuels, oils, distillation products, etc. (HS Codes 27), Pearls, precious stones, metals, coins, etc. (HS Codes 71) and Nuclear reactors, boilers, machinery, etc. (HS Codes 84) established the top 3 HS Codes commodities in India's exports to the world in December 2021, accounting for about 32% share of the export-value in the month of December 2021. Moreover, only 3 commodities with HS Codes (2digit) 27, 72, 76 & 52 mirrored an upward trend in YoY Change (%) and the rest reflected a downward trend, which is not so appealing.

The following tables elucidates the 4-digit HS codes for the top 5 ITC-HS Commodities with the largest shares in India's export during December 2021









Figure from 2 to 6: Five Major Commodities of India's Exports from Top 15 ITC-HS Codes during Dec 2017 to Dec 2021












Figure 2: Mineral fuels, oils, distillation products, etc. (ITC HS CODE -27):

During the month of December 2021 recorded the highest share of 18%, with the next highest share of 15% registered during December 2018 & the third highest share of 14%(i.e.13.82) realized during December 20119, eventually with the lowest share of 9% during December 2020.

During the_month of December 2017 registered the highest share of 12%, with next highest share of 10% during December 2020 and the third highest share of 9% (i.e. 9.48%) during December 2018 & the lowest share of 8% (i.e. 7.67%) during December 2021

The month of December 2019 registered the highest share of 7% (i.e. 6.93%), with the next highest share 6% (i.e. 6.46%) in December 2020. The lowest share of 6% (i.e. 5.93%) during December 2017.

<u>Figure 5: Electrical, Electronic equipment (ITC HS CODE - 85):</u>





From the Table 3 & Figure 7, it is observed that Petroleum products (PC Code S6), Aluminum, products of aluminum (PC Code L5) and Iron and Steel (PC Code L3) established the top 3 PC Codes in India's Exports from the world in December 2021, accounting for around 25% of the export-value in December 2021. Moreover, only 3 commodities with PC Codes (2digit) S6, L3 & L5 echoed an upward trend in YoY Change(%) & the rest reflected a downward trend, which is not so alluring.



From the Table 4 and Figure 8 establishes that Gujarat, Maharashtra & Tamil Nadu constituted the top 3 States in India's Exports from the world in December 2021, accounting for 56% of the total export-value in December 2021. In totality five states displayed an upward trend in YoY Change (%).

From the Table 5 and Figure 9, it is observed that Mineral fuels, oils, distillation products, etc (HS Codes 27), Pearls, precious stones, metals, coins, etc (HS Codes 71) and Electrical, electronic equipment (HS Codes 85) constituted the top 3 HS Codes in India's imports from the world in December 2021, accounting for about 55% share of the import-value in December 2021. Moreover, except Fertilizers, the rest reflected a downward trend in YoY Change (%).



Figure from 10 to 14: Top 5 Major Commodities of India's Imports from Top 15 ITC-HS Codes during Dec 2017 to Dec 2021







Figure 13: Nuclear reactors, boilers, machinery, etc. (ITC HS CODE -84)

Figure 13: Nuclear reactors, boilers, machinery, etc. (ITC HS CODE -84):






From Table 7 and Figure 15, recognizes that Petroleum products (PC code: S6), Pearl, precious, semi-precious stones (PC code: G5) and Drug formulations, biologicals (PC code: H8) are the top 3 PC codes that contributed to about 20%, 8% and 7% respectively in India's import value during December 2021, besides accounting for about 35% share of the total import-value in the same period. Furthermore, except Fertilizers Manufactured (PC Code H3), the rest mirrored a downward trend in YoY Change (%).



From Table 8 and Figure 16, it is found that USA, UAE and Bangladesh PR are the top 3 countries that contributed to about 17%, 7% and 4% respectively in India's export value for the month of December 2021, consequently accounting for about 28% share of the total export value in December 2021. Furthermore, India's export in five countries (Australia, Indonesia, turkey, The Netherland and Korea RP) reflected an upward trend in YoY Change (%), which is remarkable with above 100% (YoY)






Figure 28: depicts that at every month the value of Imports exceeded the exports & the gap widened gradually from April 2021 to December 2021, due to the aftermath effect of the Covid-19.




Figure 29: depicts that at every month the value of imports exceeded the exports, except during the middle of June 2020, the exports slightly surpassed the imports, likewise the gap narrowed slightly during the month of September 2020, consequently the gap widened during the month of December 2020, due to the onslaught of Covid-19.

Figure 30: Quarterly wise comparison of India's Export & Import Values In Billion UDS from April 2021 to December 2021




Figure 30: portrays that imports gradually escalated quarterly wise from April 2021 to December 2021, whereas exports augmented at lumbering pace during the same period.

Figure 31: Quarterly wise comparison of India's Export & Import Values in Billion UDS from April 2020 to December 2020




Figure 31: reveals from April 2020 to December 2020 imports skyrocketed from first quarter to second quarter, but from second quarter to third quarter ascended belatedly, correspondingly exports rose steeply from first quarter to second quarter, but from second quarter to third quarter ascended negligibly.
