

From Table 1 and Figure 1, it is observed that Mineral fuels, oils, distillation products, etc. (HS Codes 27), Electrical, Electronic Equipment etc. (HS Codes 85) and Nuclear reactors boilers, machinery, etc (HS Codes 84) proved to be the top 3 commodity groups (ITC_HS 2 digit codes) in India's exports to the world in December 2022, accounting for about 36.6% share of the total export-value in the month of December 2022. Sugar and sugar confectionery registered the highest YOY increase in export value, of about 50% in December 2022.



Figure from 2 to 6: Five Major Commodities of India's Exports from Top15 ITC-HS Codes






From Table 3 & Figure 7, it is observed that Petroleum products(PC Code S6), Drug formulations, biologicals (PC Code H8) and Pearls Precious, Semi-Precious Stones(PC Code G5) were the top 3 PC Codes as far as India's exports to the world in December 2022 were concerned, accounting for around 30.27% of the export-value in December 2022. Sugar (PC Code C4) clocked export value growth of over 50% (YoY), while Iron and steel (PC Code L3) that showed the highest YoY decline of more than 50%.

Figure 8: Share% of Top 15 State's Export December-22




Table 4 and Figure 8 establish that Gujarat, Maharashtra & Tamil Nadu constituted the top 3 States in India's exports to the world in December 2022, accounting for 60 % of the total export-value in December 2022.

Table 4(i) and Figure 8(i) delineate that Jamnagar accounts for more than 50% of the total share of Gujarat state's export to the world, followed by Surat, Bharuch and Ahmadabad in December 2022.

Table 4(ii) and Figure 8(ii) demonstrate that highest export share of 20% is that of Pune with the next highest share of 19% for Mumbai and 15% for Mumbai Suburban, followed by Thane and Raigad each with a share of less than 10%, in December 2022, for the state of Maharashtra.

Table 4(iv) & Figure 8(iv) elucidate the district-wise break down of Karnataka's exports to world in December 2022. The share of the districts of Bengaluru Urban, Dakshina Kannada and, Kolar are 30%, 24% and 13% respectively. They are followed by Bengaluru Rural and Belagavi, each with a share of 11% and 4% respectively.


Table 4(v) & Figure 8(v) elucidate that export share of Gautam Buddha Nagar, Ghaziabad and Kanpur Nagar District's share are 43%, 8% and 6% respectively. They are followed by Moradabad & Aligarh each with a share of less than 7%.

From the Table 5 and Figure 9, it is observed that Mineral fuels, oils, distillation products, etc. (HS Code 27), Electrical, electronic equipment (HS Code 85) and Nuclear reactors, boilers, machinery etc (HS-Code 84) constituted the top 3 commodity groups (ITC-HS 2 digit codes) in India's imports from the world in December 2022, accounting for about 54% share of the import value in December 2022. Aircraft, spacecraft and parts thereof (HS Code 88) registered the highest YOY increase in import of above 100% followed by Ships, boats and other floating structures (HS Code-89) of about 90%.



Figure from 10 to 14: Top 5 Major Commodities of India's Imports from Top 15 ITC-HS Codes during December 2018 to December 2022





Figure 15: Top 15 PC Codes Comprising in India's Import in December -22 (Share%)





Table 7 and Figure 15 recognize that "Petroleum Crude" (PC code: S5), "Petroleum products" (PC code: S6) and "Coal, Coke And Briquittes" (PC Code: F1 are the top 3 PC codes that contributed to about 25%, 7% and 5% respectively in India's import value during December 2022. All the PC codes registered YoY increases in India's import from December 2021 to December 2022, with the exception Petroleum Products (PC Code S6), Pearl, Precs, Semiprecs Stones (PC Code G5), Electronics Components (PC Code P2), Organic Chemicals (PC Code I3), Plastic Raw Materials (PC Code K8) and Gold (PC code: G6) that registered a YoY decline.

Figure 16: Top 15 Countries Comprising India's Export in December 2022




From Table 8 and Figure 16, it is found that USA, UAE and Netherlands are the top 3 countries that contributed to about 17%, 7% and 5% respectively in India's export value for the month of December 2022, accounting for about 29% share of the total export value in December 2022. Almost all the top countries show YoY (%) increase in export from December 2021 to December 2022, with the exception of USA ,UAE China PRP, Germany , Bangladesh PR, Hong Kong , Indonesia, that registered a YoY decline of 4%, 3%, 26, 3%, 2%, 58%, 20% and 14% respectively.

From Table 9 and Figure 17, it is found that China P Rp, USA and Russia are the top 3 countries that contributed to about 13%, 9% and 7% respectively in India's import value for the month of December 2022, consequently accounting for about 29% share of the total import value in December 2022. Russia registered the highest YOY increase in imports of above 300%. All the other countries registered increases in import from December 2021 to December 2022, with the exception of China P Rp, UAE, Iraq, Hong Kong, Australia and Malaysia that registered YoY declines of 8%,20%,19%,21%,20% and 13% respectively.

Table 10 validates the share of 15 Ports in terms of largest contributions to Indian exports. Sez Jamnagar (Reliance), Nhava Sheva Sea and Mundra are the top 3 ports through which Indian exports took place with a total contribution of 37% share of the total export value in December 2022. Chennai Air registered the highest YOY increase of above 80% in export value. All the other ports registered increases in India's exports from December 2021 to December 2022, with the exception of Nhava Sheva Sea ,Dpcc Mumbai,Sikka ,Visakhapatnam Sea,Tuticorin Sea and Kandla Sea that registered the YoY declines of 4%,27%,9%,19%,17% and 0.31% respectively.

VIII. Policy Analysis for High Sugar Exports – "India's exports turn sweeter":

The Principal Commodity C4 (Sugar) exports jumped by 53% from December 2021 to December 2022. Interestingly, aluminium exports (ITC HS 76) registered YoY decline of over 50% in December 2022 and telecom instruments (PC P4) saw YoY increase of over 43% during this period.

India's sugar & sugar confectionery exports rose to over 7 times in April-December 2022 as compared to the same period in 2013. To dovetail the price stability of domestic sugar with the financial positions of sugar mills in the country, based on estimate of sugarcane production, Government of India allowed sugar export of upto 60 LMT during the sugar season 2022-23. Measures in the early financial year for timely payment and low stock carrying cost of sugar mills resulted in early clearance of cane arrears of farmers. In the sugar export policy for SS 2022-23, Government announced sugar mill wise export quota based on an objective formula using average production of sugar mills in last three years and average sugar production of the country in last 3 years. Again, to fasttrack sugar exports, mills may decide to surrender the sugar export quota partially or fully within 60 days of the date of issue of order or swap the export quota with domestic quota within 60 days. With government's focus area on production of ethanol for fuel import substitution, going towards green energy, higher ethanol prices for producers incentivised distilleries to divert more sugar towards ethanol.




Figure 28 illustrates export-import gap from January -December 2021, which has been widening since August 2021, purportedly with slackening of Covid-19 factors.




Figure 29 illustrates export-import gap from January to December 2022, remaining more or less stable.
